



## Recommended Browsers and Versions

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*Recommended browsers for optimal experience & performance:*

- **Firefox, most recent version**
- **Chrome, most recent version**
- **Safari 6 for OS X 10.7 or later**
- **Internet Explorer 10**

## Other Browsers and Versions

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*The Learning Management System will operate on the browsers listed below, but with qualifications:*

- **Safari 5 (minimum version)**

Only the most recent version of Safari, Safari 6 (OS 10.7 or later required), supports drag-and-drop upload.

- **Internet Explorer 9**

(Does not support drag-and-drop upload and may cause layout bugs)

On some pages, I.E. 9 will not display the layout correctly unless the browser is operating in compatibility mode.

To turn on compatibility mode in I.E. 9, in the tool bar, click the Compatibility Mode icon (to right of address bar). Compatibility Mode is enabled when the icon is shaded dark. See further instructions on Compatibility View below.

Note to Internet Explorer 8 users: Please upgrade to Internet Explorer 9 or use the latest version of Firefox or Chrome.




## Fixing Problems with Compatibility View

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Sometimes websites don't look like you expect them to. Images might not appear, menus might be out of place, and text could be jumbled together. This might be caused by a compatibility problem between Internet Explorer and the site you're on. Sometimes this can be fixed by adding the site to your Compatibility View list.


### *For Internet Explorer 11*

- **To add a site to the Compatibility View list**
  1. Open the desktop, and then tap or click the Internet Explorer icon on the taskbar.
  2. Tap or click the Tools button , and then tap or click Compatibility View settings.
  3. Under Add this website, enter the URL of the site you want to add to the list, and then tap or click Add.

*Note: Once you turn on Compatibility View, Internet Explorer will automatically show that site in Compatibility View each time you visit. You can turn it off by removing it from the your compatibility list.*

### *For Internet Explorer 8, 9, & 10*

- **To turn on Compatibility View**
  1. See if the Compatibility View button  appears in the Address bar. (If you don't see the button, there's no need to turn on Compatibility View.)
  2. Tap or click the Compatibility View button  to display the site in Compatibility View.

*Note: Once you turn on Compatibility View, Internet Explorer will automatically show that site in Compatibility View each time you visit. You can turn it off by tapping or clicking the button  again.*
